We know that many families were affected by the challenges of the pandemic (including mental health & well-being, financial, physical health, employment etc...) and life as we knew it did change in many ways. In hopes of getting our students re-engaged, emphasizing routines & lifelong value of attendance for well-being, learning and achievement will be important to discuss at home as well as at school.

During the upcoming break, it will also be important for students and families to be active. Going for a walk, hike, snowshoe, ski, skating (will we have snow??) etc....are great ways to burn off some of those delicious holiday calories and maintain our health.

Aaron is an Anishinaabe man and an RRSD Grad from Erickson Collegiate who grew up on Rolling River First Nation, Treaty 4. His mother is from Swan Lake First Nation, Treaty 1. Aaron created his own multi-media and tourism business, <u>Giiwe Media</u>, dedicated to supporting and elevating Indigenous voices and history throughout Canada. As part of his business, he does public speaking on Indigenous Culture and Reconciliation, consulting with organizations on how to enhance Indigenous cultural competency and organizes markets for Indigenous artisans to share and sell their work.

One of Aaron's markets is coming up this Saturday at Clear Lake: <u>Gathering of Creations:</u> <u>Christmas in the park — Giiwe Media</u>. Aaron also recently held a position being a cultural liaison between RMNP and surrounding Indigenous (whose traditional lands are within RMNP. He has a wealth of knowledge in this area.

We will share more information with you as we welcome Aaron to our school this year.
